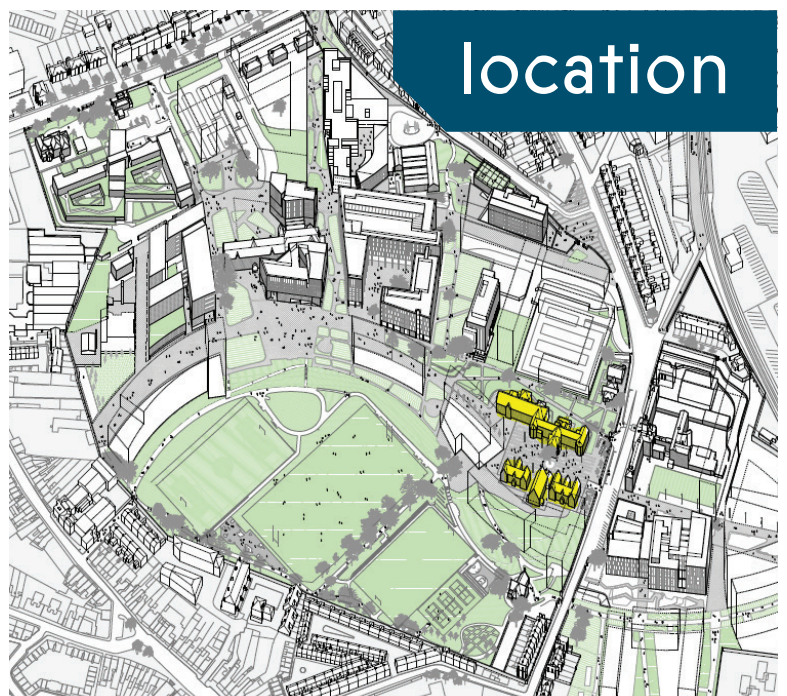
An Croí (“The Heart” in Irish) is the main focus point of the campus. It consists of four historical buildings, dating from the middle of the 19th century. These buildings, once part of the Richmond Asylum that operated in Grangegorman during the 19th and 20th centuries, were carefully and tastefully brought back into use in 2014 as modern university spaces.

Rathdown House, the largest of the buildings, now operates as a “one-stop shop” for all student queries as well as housing a 250 seat canteen.

Glassmanogue operates as the campus gym and **Bradogue** serves as office space for TU Dublin staff.

St. Laurence’s Church, with its original stain glass windows, is a unique event space for the university which still serves mass at lunchtimes on Thursdays.

All of these buildings have their original exterior stonework intact and between them stands the same sycamore tree that has grown on the site for decades. For this reason, walking through An Croí can feel like walking back in time.
