

# Greenway Hub

The Greenway Hub was the first new building in Grangegorman, built for the university in 2015. Funded through the Programme for Research in Third Level Institutions (PRTL I) and Enterprise Ireland, this five storey research and innovation facility provides a range of research laboratories, meeting spaces, and modern, open plan office spaces.

The building houses TU Dublin's Environmental Sustainability and Health Institute (ESHI) which focuses on studying the interactions between Environment and Health in the areas of Energy, Food, Policy, Lifestyle, Water, and Bio-monitoring. The Greenway Hub is also home to TU Dublin Hothouse, an award-winning Innovation and Technology Transfer Office responsible for the commercialisation of intellectual property arising from TU Dublin research. Part of Hothouse's work is administering, along with Enterprise Ireland, the use of the Greenway Hub as an incubation centre for aiding and supporting Irish start-up companies.
