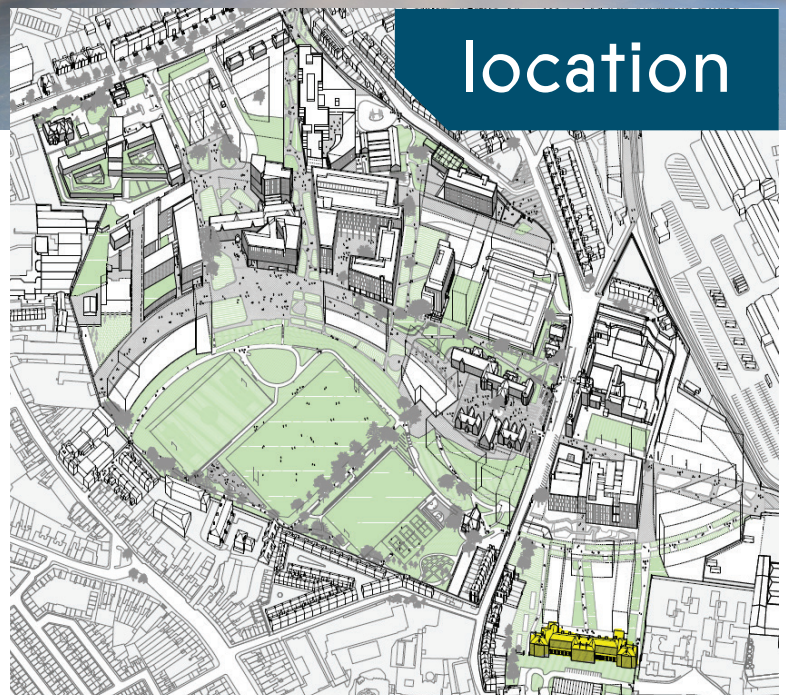


Lower House

Built between 1810 and 1815, Lower House is the oldest remaining building of the Richmond Asylum that operated in Grangegorman for most of the 19th and 20th centuries. The building was abandoned in the 1980s and was in a serious state of disrepair when it came into TU Dublin ownership.

However, it has now been completely refurbished and brought back into use as a Student Hub for the campus. Offering modern styling and facilities while retaining its original characteristics, Lower House is one of the most interesting and impressive buildings on the campus.
