Shortage of primary school teachers at the moment 3,200 primary schools in Ireland



Entry Requirements – usually:

Minimum 2.2 Level 8 Honours degree or higher qualification (level 9 or 10)

Leaving Certificate requirements (for 2021 Entry)

H4 (HC1/HC2) in Irish

O4/H7 (OC1/OC2/HE) in Maths

O4/H7 (OC1/OC2/HE) in English or first arts in these subjects



What if I don't have the H4 in Irish?

Re-sit Leaving Cert Honours Irish - for example: Institute of education, Kilroys,
 Crumlin college of education etc. or ask in your previous secondary school

Application process –details to be announced by the colleges by end 2021

Closing date for full time applications normally February/early March

Apply for TegB1 oral Irish interview by 3rd January (2021) –have to achieve at least 65% This is so result of /TEGB1 will be in by the time interviews arise - *Useful to sit TEG B1 in second year of college and can resit to get higher mark*


Applicants can apply to all courses

Hibernia: September (closing date 21st June) April (closing date 1st Feb) but the *sooner you'll be interviewed*

If no TegB1 completed, they will do their own Irish interview – whole section on their website about this

References – e.g. Lecturer from current course Hibernia look for personal statement – full time providers may do too

Interview


Generally, once you meet all the criteria, you will be offered an interview c.20 mins

- Good to have got some classroom observation beforehand
- Do some research into what's involved in teaching different years etc. talk to teachers
- How are phonics taught? What is Aistear?
- How are special educational needs supports provided in primary schools?
- Be familiar with curriculum and current issues
- Think through about why you want to teach
- Can you pick through anything in your undergraduate degree that would be relevant
- Jobs, voluntary work, experience with children
- Experience of working with diverse groups
- If you're good at music, art, sports etc. think about how you could use in the primary school setting
- Relevant personal qualities (communication style, leadership, patience etc.) have examples, as it's
- important to present evidence of these



Entry Requirements and Procedure for 2021

 This is a postgraduate teacher education programme for primary teaching (2021–2023) for persons who possess an honours Bachelor Degree at Level 8 or those who expect to have successfully completed final examinations before Monday, 5th July 2021.

This is a full-time programme, commencing in September 2021 and concluding in summer 2023 and will be delivered in the following Higher Education Institutions:

Persons who successfully complete this programme are eligible to be registered by the Teaching Council under Route 1: Primary and will thereby be eligible for appointment in primary schools.

2. Application Procedure & Closing Date

Teastas Eorpach na Gaeilge (TEG) for all candidates

Please note that all prospective applicants must have completed and achieved 65% or higher in the oral component of the Teastas Eorpach na Gaeilge (TEG) Meánleibhéal 1 (B1) Irish examination prior to the closing date (i.e. 29th March 2021) to satisfy the entry requirements.

Registration is now open and the closing date for TEG online applications is **5pm on Wednesday**, 6th **January 2021**. If you have not already registered for the Teast-Borpach na Gaeilge (TEG) (ORAL) examination, you will need to register at this link.

The oral Irish examination will be administered by the Centre for Irish Language Research, Teaching and Testing in Maynooth University and all

UK



 To be registered with the teaching council here in Ireland, you need to do a PGCE (England. NI and Wales) or the Postgraduate diploma in Education in Scotland, and the course has to be qualified teacher status (QTS)

Choose general primary (not upper primary or lower primary)

• £9250 – but course is only one year – loans available in Scotland, if you intend to stay there

- Initial closing date January if enough good quality applications are made early, the date may close off soon after — apply early to popular courses

Entry requirements – can change

- Generally in the UK, you need Ordinary Grade C in English and Mathematics and a Grade C in Science subject (in the past didn't need science for Scotland, and sometimes Home EC S&S and geography counted as science) – check with individual colleges for specific or additional requirements
- If you do not hold the Leaving Certificate requirements, some institutions may offer special equivalence tests
- School based observation (minimum 2 weeks) is necessary before applying preferably in more than 1 school and demonstrate relevance of
 undergraduate course to primary school curriculum

Personal Statement - if college carrying out interviews good for that

- Why do you want to be a teacher?
 - How did you develop an interest in teaching?
 - What have you learned from any relevant experience?
 - Show that you know what is involved in this work What will you bring to the job?
- Show that you have these **skills** needed to be a good teacher and give examples...
- Committed / motivated
- Enthusiastic / Resilient
- People / team-working skills
- Good communication skills
- Organised
- Knowledge of subjects / interest in the curriculum



 On your return to have to meet the Irish language requirement - this is assessed by a test SCG or OCG – adaptation and assessment https://ilrweb.ie/ (Marino)
