

New Frontiers – Who is it for?

- Entrepreneurs from early-stage start-up companies in Ireland
- Intend to establish a manufacturing or internationally-traded services business
- Are growth-orientated planning to achieve turnover greater than €500,000 and create more than five jobs in three to five years' time.
- Will develop a business that is built upon on a strong foundation of innovation and/or technology.
- Can show **evidence of a commercial market** for the proposed product or service.

LEO Feasibility Study Grant	€15,000 matched funding (company will need to provide same funding)	Researching market demand for a product or service	Rolling call
LEO Priming Grant	€150,000 matched funding (company will need to provide same funding)	Start-ups within first 18 months with ambition to trade internationally	Rolling call
Enterprise Ireland Innovation Voucher	€5,000	Short research project with HEI	Rolling call
Competitive Start Fund	€50,000	Very early stage start-ups	3 times per year
Innovative HPSU Fund	50% of an investment round up to €250,000	Start-ups at seed round stage	Rolling call
LEO Start your own business programme	None	Help in assessing your idea, its viability and to decide if you should proceed or take a step back.	Varies by location
