





Audiation Test

The third and final part of the entrance test is an aural aptitude test which does not require any specific training or preparation and is designed to give an indication of a candidate's aptitude for music studies. The idea is quite simple – you hear a short musical phrase played twice and by simply ticking a box you indicate if the second playing was (i) the same as the first, (ii) rhythmically different or (iii) had a change in one or more pitches. We will explain all of this to you clearly at the exam and we even have a short practice run to make sure everyone follows the idea.
